In-State Runaway

37-1-102 In-State Runaway

(33) “Unruly child” means a child in need of treatment and rehabilitation who:
(D) Is away from the home, residence or any other residential placement of the child's parent(s), guardian or other legal custodian without their consent. Such child shall be known and defined as a “runaway”;

37-4-101. Interstate Compact for Juveniles.

The compacting states to this Interstate Compact recognize that each state is responsible for the proper supervision or return of juveniles, delinquents and status offenders who are on probation or parole and who have absconded, escaped or run away from supervision and control and in so doing have endangered their own safety and the safety of others. The compacting states also recognize that each state is responsible for the safe return of juveniles who have run away from home and in doing so have left their state of residence.

Definitions

Absconder: a juvenile probationer who hides, conceals, or absents him/herself so that he/she is unavailable for the legal process or authorized control.

Holding State: The state where the juvenile is located.

Home State: The state where the legal guardian or custodial agency is located.

Receiving State: a state to which a juvenile is sent for supervision under the provision of the ICJ.

Sending state: a state which has sent or is in the process of sending juvenile to another state for supervision under the provisions of the ICJ.

Travel permit: written permission granted to a juvenile authorizing travel from one state to another

Warrant: an order authorizing any law enforcement or peace officer to apprehend and detain a specified juvenile.

TO ANY LAWFUL OFFICER:

Pursuant to Pursuant to TCA 37-1-122 and Rule 109 of the Tennessee Rules of Juvenile Practice and Procedure and it appearing to the court based upon a judicial determination, there is probable cause to believe the child is in need of the immediate protection of the court because The child cannot be located by the supervising person, persons, or entity after documented efforts to locate the child.

You are commanded to attach the body of **Laura Ingalls** if to be found in your county, and have her brought before the Judge of the Knox County Juvenile Court then and there to answer to the State on the charges of: **Violation of County Probation (TCA 37-1-131), a Violation.**

When the Court receives information that the child may have crossed state lines, the sheriff needs to enter the warrant into NCIC nationwide.

Non-Voluntary Return

A requisition must be filed using the [Form I or II](#)

If legal guardian is unable or refused to file the requisition, the home state must initiate the requisition.

The home state has 60 days from notice of refusal to petition the court for the requisition.

The home state makes transportation arrangements.

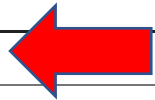

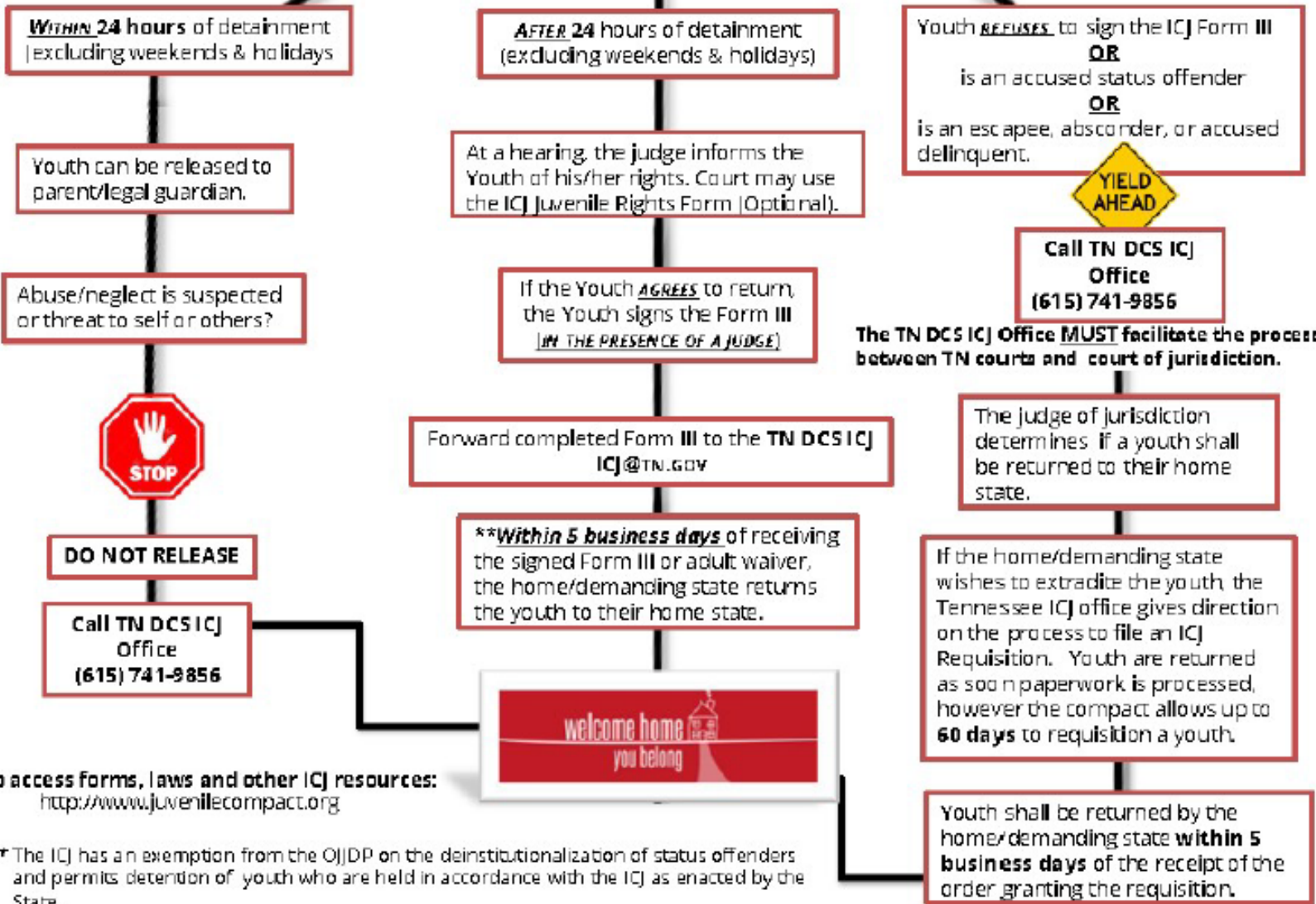

- Add a Facility Stay with ICJ Hold Classification.
- A Detention Hearing is held.
 - Court advises the child of their rights.
 - If youth Agrees to return, youth signs Form III Consent for Voluntary Return.
 - If youth REFUSES to return call TN DCS ICJ Office 615-741-9856
 - TN DCS ICJ office MUST facilitate the process.

The JJDPA which limits detention of “status offenders” specifically allows detention of minors pursuant to the ICJ.

YOU HAVE AN OUT OF STATE RUNAWAY DETAINED.

All runaway youth detained longer than 24 hours *SHALL BE* held *SECURELY* *.**

*** The ICJ has an exemption from the OJJDP on the deinstitutionalization of status offenders and permits detention of youth who are held in accordance with the ICJ as enacted by the State.

TRANSFERS OF SUPERVISION

A supervised juvenile who is relocating to another state must be transferred through the ICJ if the juvenile:

- Is classified as a juvenile in the sending state; and
- Is an adjudicated delinquent, adjudicated status offender, or has a deferred adjudication; and
- Is under the jurisdiction of a court of appropriate authority; and
- Has a plan to relocate for a period exceeding 90 days; and
- Has more than 90 days of supervision remaining; and
- Will reside with a legal guardian, relative, non-relative or independently; OR
- Is a fulltime student at an accredited secondary school, university/college, or a licensed specialized training program.

A juvenile is not eligible for transfer under the Compact if the sole condition is to collect restitution or if traveling to a residential facility.

Sending a Case for Supervision

Sending state's ICJ Office submits a referral through the electronic data system, including:

- ICJ Forms IV, V, and VI - paperwork is sent to ICJ Office (Corrie Copeland)
- Form VII: Travel Permit is required
- Petition(s) and/or Arrest Report(s)
- Order(s) of Adjudication/Disposition
- Conditions of Supervision
- Legal and Social History
- Supervision Summary
- Other documents may be required for parolees or sex offenders

Scan these forms into Quest
Using document called "Scanned ICJ Form"

- Sending state supervises the case until it is accepted by receiving state.
- Sending state retains jurisdiction throughout the supervision.
- If the juvenile already resides in the receiving state, the receiving state obtains the juvenile's signature on the Form VI.

Mandatory Travel Permits

Travel Permits are mandatory for the following juveniles traveling out-of-state over 24 consecutive hours:

Juveniles who have been adjudicated and are on supervision for:

- Sex-related offenses;
- Violent offenses that have resulted in personal injury or death; or
- Offenses committed with a weapon.

Juveniles who are one of the following:

- State committed;
- Relocating pending a transfer of supervision;
- Returning to the state from which they were transferred;
- Transferring to a subsequent state; or
- Transferred and the victim notification laws require notification.

TRAVEL PERMITS MAY NOT EXCEED 90 DAYS

- If a Travel Permit exceeds 30 calendar days, the sending state provides instructions for the juvenile to maintain contact the supervising agency.
